Stopping and Parking

We would ask you again, to act with consideration when dropping your children to school and when collecting them.

We have managed to reduce the congestion over the past two years, but still, we have some parents

1. Stopping on zig zag lines
2. Parking across the driveways of local residents
3. Parking on the private driveways of our local residents

We are working with the local police and Birmingham City Council, as well as 'Living Streets', in order to deal with these issues and, ultimately, make this a safe area for you and your children and to ensure that our neighbours are treated kindly, and with respect.

We have been advised that any inappropriate parking can be reported to the local police, either by us, you as parents, or by our neighbours by photographing the license plates of vehicles. If this happens, letters will be sent out to the relevant vehicle owners: recurrent offences will result in further legal action being taken. This is the last thing that we want to happen.

We would urge that if it is necessary for you to drive to school, then you park in a place that is both legal and courteous.
