



Many thanks for your Christmas cards, gifts and well wishes. They are very much appreciated.



























For this reason, we have kept money we ask for in school to as little as possible.


Thank you for when you do send donations.

Birmingham City Council and the Archdiocese of Birmingham recommended to the MAC board and Local Governing Board that St Wilfrid's Catholic Primary School reduce the PAN (Published Admissions Number) from 60 to 30 <u>for September 2024/25 intake</u>. This is due to a surplus of school places in the Birmingham area and Hodge Hill ward and affects all local schools. <u>To support this process we are required to consult with all stakeholders.</u>


The consultation period started on, Monday 28 November 2022 and will end on Monday 9 January 2023.








Utility Bills- Get SMART or even a smart meter

- Contact your energy supplier and find out about installing a meter that reads your gas and electricity and doesn't rely on an estimation.
- It can really help to identify how you use energy at home and costs involved. It also makes children very conscious about the usage and how they can help towards reducing our carbon footprint.

Heating up your home

- Set a timer for the heating to come on and off
- Only heat the rooms you are using
- Wear layered clothes and socks
- Make sure there are no draughts coming in through the doors
- Close curtains and doors to retain heat

Food and Drink

- Food swaps- choose wonky vegetables and fruit at reduced cost.
- Make a list and make sure you stick to it.

Grants and Government Support

- COSARAF: Grants for families facing hardships
- <u>Family Fund</u>: Family funds provides families raising a disabled or seriously ill child and those on a low income
- <u>Buttle Uk:</u> A charity dedicated to helping children in the UK who have experienced crisis and living in financial hardship.

Government Support

Individuals may be able to get a payment to help with the cost of living, if they are getting certain benefits.

There are 3 different types of payment:

- Cost of living payment
- Disability cost of living payment
- Pensioner cost of living payment

Local Welfare Provision

There are 2 types of payment made from this provision:

- 1. Crisis payment made for essential foods and clothing (payment within 2 working days)
- 2. Community Support Grant made for essential white goods and furniture, to sustain housing needs (payment within 10 working days).
