

Attendance

'Parents are responsible for making sure that their children of compulsory school age receive efficient full-time education that is suitable to the child's age, ability and aptitude and to any special educational needs the child may have.
This can be by regular attendance at school, alternative provision, or otherwise (e.g. the parent can choose to educate their child at home)' Section 7, Education Act 1996

In September, a new framework for attendance procedures will come into effect. This will be shared with you in due course, however, this is even more stringent.

We have a number of procedures in place at school to encourage your children to attend but we need your help with this also.

A reminder that we can not authorise term-time leave except in exceptional circumstances.

The competition closes on 11 July 2022. Competition details and how to enter can be found on the <u>Be Birmingham website</u>.




















Luke 10:1-12, 17-20


