



Keeping Safe:

In school, we encourage all of our pupils to T.H.I.N.K before posting on social media.

We respectfully ask all parents to do this too, especially when posting about the school or staff members. Not only does it set the right example for our children and community, posts that have not been resolved in school can quickly escalate.

Although you may believe your posts are private, remember, your social media 'friends' may screen shot this and send them to others, including school.

At St Wilfrid's we are one school family-children, wider families, staff and governors-but like any family, sometimes there are problems to be resolved. Together we can do this!

I politely request that if any derogatory posts regarding the school, or school staff, have been posted on social media, they are removed straight away.

If any issues do arise that you would like to be resolved, please follow the lines of escalation below.

















If there is a problem, who do I need to speak to?

Who to talk to	What will happen, who will know about it and what do I do next if it isn't resolved?
Class Teacher	In the first instance, if there is a problem, please speak to your child's class teacher. In most cases, they will be able to resolve issues. All class teachers share this information with school leaders via our online recording system CPOMS, but we trust that they are the best professional to deal with issues being raised for the first time. * If you raise an issue with the class teacher and they feel it needs to be escalated to a DSL, phase leader,
	Head of School or Interim Executive Head Teacher, they will do this as soon as possible.
Phase Leader	If the issue is not resolved within a reasonable amount of time (usually a period of at least 1 school week) please arrange to meet with the appropriate phase leader for your child's class: EYFS Phase Leader - Nursery or Reception – Mrs F Clarke Key Stage 1 Phase Leader - Year 1 and Year 2 - Ms J Brown Lower Key Stage 2 Phase Leader - Year 3 and Year 4 – Mrs R McClenaghan Upper Key Stage 2 Phase Leader - Year 5 and Year 6 – Mrs R Gregory
	If the phase leader is your class teacher, please request to meet with another of the phase leaders.
	Phase leaders discuss any issues within our weekly Senior Leadership Meetings as well as sharing the information on our online recording system CPOMS. ** If you raise an issue with a Phase leader and they feel it needs to be escalated to the Head of School of Interim Executive Head Teacher, they will do this as soon as possible.
Head of School	If the issue is not resolved within a reasonable amount of time (usually a period of at least 1 school week since meeting the Phase Leader) please arrange to meet with our Head of School. Acting Head of School- Mrs L Husted
	**** If you raise an issue with the Head of School and they feel it needs to be escalated to the Interim Executive Head Teacher, they will do this as soon as possible.
Executive Head Teacher	From time to time, if incidents cannot be resolved, meetings with the Interim Executive Head Teacher may be appropriate. Interim Executive Head Teacher- Mrs H Milligan
Complaints procedure	Whilst we are confident most problems can be resolved in school, we appreciate, this may not always be the case.
