

If you would be interested in buying one of our handmade bird feeders for your own outdoor space, priced at £1, please contact a member of the Year 3 team.




### Bottle Collection

### Today we went cashless for tuck!







As with all changes, there will be a few teething problems - there will be a period of time when we are all learning how to use this new system and how to make sure it works in the way we need it to!

For every child who told us that they were expecting tuck, we really hope that we ensured that they were provided for today, even if the money and / or order was not on your account on ParentPay. Remember, that infant classes are also provided with free fruit if they choose to have some.

In order for the system to work properly, there's a few things that you can help us with:

- 1. Make sure that your ParentPay account has the correct money in (£1 per day)
- 2. Make sure that you have selected their choice ie a slice of toast and juice OR a slice of toast and a milkshake
- 3. Please make sure that you have made the selection BEFORE 9:30 am in the morning

### If you have ordered tuck beforehand and then your child is absent, your account will not be charged.

For those people who have asked for another copy of their ParentPay log in, Mrs Harrison will send these out today - if you have any problems, please call Mrs Harrison.

In the meantime, please remain patient - as you have been - thank you!
