







Uniform policy

Rights Respecting Schools' Article/s

Article 8 – I have the rights to an identity

Article 15 – I have the right to meet friends and join groups

It is our school policy that all children wear school uniform when attending school, or when participating in school-organised events outside normal school hours. We ask children to wear their polo-shirts/ shirts tucked into their skirts, shorts or trousers and to take a pride in their personal appearance.

School uniform is a way of showing that the children are READY, RESPECTFUL and SAFE, in line with our whole-school ethos.

Some items of uniform can be bought with the St Wilfrid's Catholic Primary School logo on, whilst other plain items are easily available, at very competitive prices, at local shops including supermarkets. A complete list of the items needed for school uniform, including those for P.E, is included in this policy.

"We believe that the wearing of a school uniform enables students to identify with their school, gives a sense of belonging, is practical and smart, reinforces a positive work ethos and reduces expenditure for parents/carers".

Aims and objectives

The aims of this policy are to:

- ensure clarity of what can be worn or not at school;
- promote a sense of pride in our school;
- help to create a sense of community and belonging towards the school;
- ensure that our pupils can be clearly identified with our school;
- support our commitment to inclusion;
- ensure pupils' uniforms are practical, smart, affordable and are suitable, with health and safety in mind;
- ensure that pupils are dressed smartly.

Jewellery, Make-up, and Nail Varnish.

For health and safety reasons, we do not allow children to wear jewellery. The exception to this rule is one pair of small stud earrings. Children are required to remove or cover any items (including earrings) during PE lessons to prevent them from causing injury. Your child's class teacher will advise you when PE lessons are to take place so earrings can be removed or covered. Please note: Teachers are not permitted to remove earrings.

Make up and nail varnish should not be worn to school unless for an out of school hours, function, for example a school disco. Smart devices, such as smart watches or fitness trackers, are not allowed to be worn by pupils to school. However, a digital or analogue watch may be worn but must be removed for safety reasons during PE lessons.

Footwear

All pupils are required to wear flat, plain black shoes without logos. These should be closed in with no toes visible. Sandals and flip-flops are not permitted.

Adaptations for Inclement Weather

In the cold weather, particularly in the winter months, children are expected to wear coats and are permitted to wear a hat/ear-muffs, scarf and gloves. Boots may also be worn for the journey to school during wet or snowy weather, however, children will be expected to change into their shoes once inside the building. Please ensure that all items are clearly named. On hot days all children are expected to wear full uniform (although not jumpers). Items such as polo-shirts / short-sleeved shirts, tailored shorts and summer dresses are all appropriate in the hot weather.

The Role of Parents

We believe that one of the responsibilities of parents is to ensure that their child has the correct uniform and PE kit, and that it is clean, in good repair and that the child's name is written on all items. If a parent has difficulties for any reason with fulfilling this request, they are asked to speak confidentially to a senior member of staff to discuss the issues. Parents should be assured that we will do all we can to help. Children who arrive at school wearing non-school uniform or PE clothing will be loaned an appropriate item from school where possible. Parents will be contacted to discuss the matter and may be requested to return to school with correct clothing.

The school welcomes children from all backgrounds and faith communities. If there are serious reasons, for example on religious grounds, why parents want their child to wear clothes that differ from our school uniform, the school will consider such requests sympathetically. If any parent would like to request a modification to the uniform policy they should, in the first instance, contact the Head of School.

The role of staff

Staff should support the Leadership Team in maintaining high standards of uniform dress. They should ensure that they are role models in the wearing of appropriate clothing. Where pupils fail to wear the correct uniform, staff should make discreet and sympathetic enquiries. Where pupils are wearing the correct uniform, staff should give positive encouragement. Staff should also be aware that sometimes a pupil's standard of dress may indicate care issues at home. If this is suspected, it should be referred to a Designated Safeguarding Lead (DSL).

The Role of Governors

The governing body supports the Head of School in implementing the school's uniform policy. It considers all representations from parents regarding the uniform policy and liaises with the Head of School to ensure that the policy is implemented fairly and with sensitivity. It is the governors' responsibility to ensure that the school uniform meets all regulations concerning equal opportunities. Governors ensure that the school uniform policy enables children to dress sensibly, in clothing that is hardwearing, safe and practical. Special Circumstances dispensation can be requested for temporary exception from the prescribed school uniform or elements of it. This will usually be on medical grounds or for other exceptional circumstances. The Executive Head and/or Head of School will have the ultimate decision on granting or refusing this.

Lost Property

Any unidentified items of school uniform will be taken to the school office. Students are encouraged to look here to reclaim lost property, on the understanding that the found item will be clearly named.

Children can become upset as a result of lost clothing. Please help us to reunite lost items of clothing with their owners by labelling items with your child's name. Any lost property unclaimed at the end of each week will be placed on the playground (weather permitting) for parents/carers to look through.

Help providing Uniform

The pastoral team are able to provide some items of second hand school uniforms to families who may require these. Please contact them via the school office if you would like to discuss this further.

School Uniform List

Our school uniform colour is a combination of white, blue, yellow and grey. Most items can be bought from High Street shops. Items marked with an * below can be bought with the school logo on if preferred through https://myclothing.com/. Simply search for our school using the school postcode B36 8LY and follow the link to make your purchase.

Our school uniform is gender neutral and consists of the following:

All children

Blue Book bag *

White shirt/polo shirt.

Blue/yellow school tie to be worn with shirt. (Can be purchased from school office and paid for via parent pay) Blue school jumper/sweatshirt or cardigan either plain or with school badge. *

Grev skirt/pinafore dress/shorts/trousers (not jogging bottoms)

Please note skirts and tailored shorts should be a minimum of knee length and of a style which allows children to sit comfortably on the floor. Three-quarter, calf-length and full-length leggings should not be worn.

Plain white/grey/black socks or tights

Blue & white checked dresses (Summer term)

Shoes should be flat, black and appropriate for school, not trainers. Your child should wear shoes which he or she can manage to do up independently Please do not send your child to school in shoes which prevent them from running in the playground.

P.E. Kit (to be kept at school)

Children need a change of clothes and footwear for P.E (for health and hygiene reasons)

All Children

Plain black/blue shorts

Plain black/blue jogging bottoms for colder weather

Blue school polo shirt * (no football shirts)

Appropriate footwear is essential:

Black PE pumps (Velcro fastening for EYFS and KS1) should be worn. Please note these will be kept at school.

Tights must be removed for PE lessons

Swimming Years 3-6 only

Girls - One-piece swimming costume

Boys - Trunks - above the knee

A towel will be required for swimming lessons
