With the weather due to heat up again next week, we need to take precautions to try to ensure that our children are looked after in the best way possible:


### You should-

- Make sure that you have applied suncream to your child before they come to school
- · Make sure your child brings a hat to school to wear if and when they are outside
- Make sure that they are in the appropriate clothing—this can either be <u>SUMMER school uniform</u>, or <u>school</u> PE kit.

### We will-

- Ensure that our classrooms are well ventilated
- Ensure that the children get fresh air whilst limiting the amount of time spent outside in direct sunshine
- Ensure that the children continue to have access to their water bottles and that these are replenished, when necessary
- Limit physical exertion such as PE lessons, high impact games and sports when outside

You may find that your child comes home and tells you that they spent time away from their classroom today, either outside or in cooler areas of the school—particularly those in the upstairs classrooms. It is our way of keeping them safe! ANY UPDATES, we will let you know.

In school Mondays and some Thurs - available to speak face to face or on the telephone via appointment, or, in an emergen- cy, sooner, to support with at- tendance

You may find that any of these members of our team may call you if they need to discuss how to support your or your child's need, or if we can't get hold of you and your child is absent, they may call round to your house to make sure that you and your family are well. We have a commitment to safeguarding and, in line with protocol, we have a duty of care to you as a member of our St Wilfrid's family, so if we contact you or call round to your house it is with your best interests at heart.




